BERT BROWNFIELD WINS THE RAY C. BLISS AWARD!

A little bit about Brother Brownfield....

Born in Akron in 1947, Bob (Bert) Brownfield was in the first graduating class of Firestone High School. He entered Akron University in the fall of 1965 and pledged Phi Kappa Tau in the spring of 1966 during the height of the Greek life on campus. At Akron Bob was awarded the A Key for active participation in college life as well as being listed in Who's Who at American Colleges and Universities.

After graduation, he began a 35 year teaching career in Twinsburg where he taught 4th and 5th graders. During that time he received a Masters in Education from the University of Akron with a specialty in language arts. Bob continued to teach, shifting to gifted education until father time caught up to him. He retired in 2005 and began volunteering in the community and working with 3 different golf organizations running tournaments and leagues.

During the time between graduation and today he has kept in touch with and enjoyed the brotherhood of dozens of Phi Taus, both in Akron and around the country.
